



## The Community...

Mountain View, Wyoming, is a small rural community nestled in the historic Bridger Valley and is the gateway to the Uinta Mountains and the Flaming Gorge reservoir. The pastures and rivers provide a beautiful setting for the spacious mountains in the background. Salt Lake City, Utah, is within easy traveling distance and provides excellent shopping and entertainment.

Mountain View is known as a "community of pride, tradition and family values." Mountain View, Wyoming, has a population of approximately 1,500 residents. The economy of Mountain View is dependent upon agriculture, mining, logging, gas and oil production, telecommunications, and tourism.

Uinta County School District No. Four consists of two schools: Mountain View K-8 and Mountain View High School. The District serves approximately 800 students (K-12), operates six rural bus routes and employs approximately 165 people.

The Board of Trustees is a five-member board that establishes policy for the District. The District has a history of outstanding education programs and a commitment to excellence in education.



## Benefits...

- Full-time staff receive one day of paid leave per month, with a total accumulation of 80 hours (10 days) per school year.
- The District pays over 80% of the required monthly contribution to the employee's state pension plan. For a first-year teacher, that works out to around \$630 a month we'll contribute to your retirement!
- For its full-time employees, the District pays approximately 90% of the total health/dental/life insurance premiums for single-only coverage.

## Our Schools...

The 130,000 sq. ft. **Mountain View K-8 School** complex houses both the K-5 Mountain View Elementary School and the 6-8 Mountain Middle School. Each instructional space is equipped with the latest state-of-the-art technology including document cameras, ceiling mounted projectors, and smart boards. A large gymnasium is used by all students as instructional space for PE and as a competition gym for sporting events. The media center includes two full-sized computer labs as well as instructional space for teaching and learning.



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**Mountain View Elementary** serves approximately 350 students in kindergarten through fifth grade. Classroom teachers, along with many interventionists/specialists and support staff, provide a high-quality, fun learning experience as they provide core instruction, interventions and extensions. This, along with positive activities that reinforce safe, respectful and responsible behaviors, create a culture of collaboration and encourage lifelong learning. Staff members, parents, and community members all work together to carry out the mission of our school: "High levels of learning through relationships, relevance, and rigor." MVE is committed to fostering partnerships to inspire all students. Through our standards-based, inclusive and challenging curriculum, students embrace learning and own their future.

**Mountain View Middle School** serves approximately 195 students enrolled in grades 6-8. We're able to offer our students excellent opportunities for learning by having smaller class sizes. Our 7-period schedule allows students to receive 50 minutes of instruction in all core areas each day with a 30-minute intervention/enrichment period at the end of the day. Our staff is dedicated to ensuring the success of every student. Multiple elective courses are offered to students while enrolled at MVMS: Family Consumer Science, Wood Shop, Drafting, Science Exploration, Band, Choir, Graphic Design and Pottery Art. Among our extra-curricular offerings are Gear Up, Student PBIS Team, Student Council, Yearbook Committee and Buff Mates, as well as the following sports for 7th/8th grade: Cross Country, Football, Volleyball, Basketball, Wrestling and Track, and Cross Country and Wrestling for 6th grade. Mountain View Middle School's mission is to ensure all of our students achieve high levels of learning required to succeed as a 21st century learner.

**Mountain View High School** serves approximately 250 students, with one of the top graduation rates in the state—over 90 percent. The mission of the school is "Meeting Student Needs – Building Pride – Attaining Excellence." We have a dedicated and caring staff that has developed quality programs that frequently obtain state-wide recognition and make our school a fun place to be. We support active involvement of teachers in making decisions affecting curriculum, staff development and building regulations. The wants and needs of our students, parents and staff members generate our school improvement plans, which, in turn, enhance our school climate.

The **Special Education Department** at Uinta School District #4 supports students with disabilities in grades K-12 in a variety of settings and in a range of activities; we aim to help students on an IEP reach their potential. Our processes include child find activities, comprehensive evaluation, IEP goal planning, and service delivery. As a team we strive to be exceptional and support each other. We have three goals: Build positive relationships, provide exceptional services to students, and be the best practitioners that we can be. We have a strong team that includes nurses, counselors, speech and language therapists, an occupational therapist, school psychologist, learning lab specialist, resource teachers, and a great support staff.
